Young couple Hyun-su and Soo-jin are about to become new parents when, one night, Soo-jin wakes up from a deep slumber to her husband's first act of parasomnia. In the weeks that follow, Hyun-su's behaviour gets increasingly more disturbing, transforming into someone unrecognisable once he falls asleep.

Debut director Jason Yu, who was once the assistant director for Academy Award-winning Bong Joon Ho, brings audiences a clever, well-crafted and genre-bending thriller that ratchets up a creeping horror towards its fantastically bonkers finale.

But when her affection moves to Samet's more affable colleague, he becomes jealous and begins to compete for her attention.

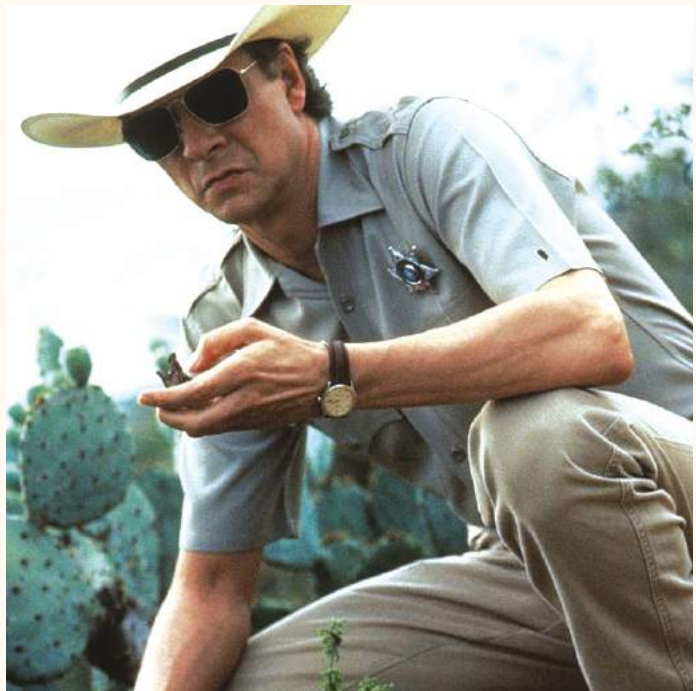

Rich Peppiatt's raucous and infectious debut feature is a heightened tale of real-life Irish rap trio Kneecap's origin story. Set in post-Troubles Belfast, childhood best friends Liam Óg and Naoise find themselves disenfranchised and uninterested in much beyond having a good time. But when a chance encounter with secondary school teacher JJ Ó Dochartaigh sparks the creation of the first Irish-language rap group, things begin down a path none of them saw coming. At the same time, a growing civil rights movement, led by JJ's partner, is fighting for the right to have the Irish language instated as an official language of Northern Ireland.

A woman's body is found by the river. Dedicated detective (and expectant father) Ma Zhe is assigned to head up the case, which leads to an obvious arrest. His superiors are pleased, but Ma wants to delve deeper. Witnesses and suspects multiply and confuse, while further crimes take place, and Ma's grip on reality within this rich, labyrinthine maze of clues begins to falter. Shot in grimy, grainy tones, deploying elements of surrealism, it's a playful, unusual and wonderfully mysterious psychological journey.

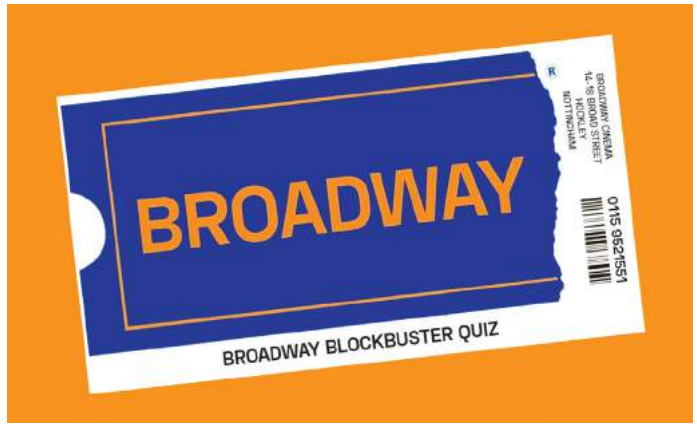

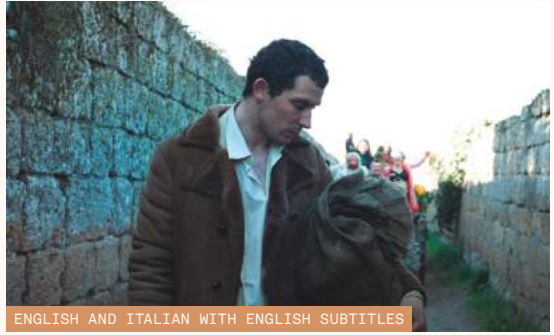
