

Director Thea Sharrock Starring Olivia Colman, Jessie Buckley UK, 2023, 100 min

A 1920s English seaside town bears witness to a dark and absurd scandal in this riotous mystery comedy starring Olivia Colman and Jessie Buckley. Based on a stranger-than-fiction true story, the film follows two neighbours: deeply conservative local Edith and rowdy Irish migrant Rose. When Edith and fellow residents begin to receive wicked anonymous letters, the town's women investigate the crime with foulmouthed Rose the prime suspect.

DUNE: PART TWO (CTBC) From Fri 1 Mar



Director Denis Villeneuve Starring Timothée Chalamet, Zendaya USA, 2024, 166m

The saga continues with the eagerly anticipated second instalment of Denis Villeneuve's adaptation of Frank Herbert's sci-fi epic, with new and returning stars Austin Butler, Florence Pugh, Timothée Chalamet and Zendaya. Dune: Part Two explores the mythic journey of Paul Aetrides as he unites with Chani and the Fremen while on a path of revenge against the conspirators who destroyed his family.

RED ISLAND (12A)

Director Robin Campillo Starring Nadia Tereszkiewicz, Quim Gutiérrez France, 2023, 117m

At the beginning of the 70s, in Madagascar, a handful of armed forces and their families live in one of the last French military bases abroad, a relic of the ending French colonial empire. Influenced by his reading of the intrepid comic book heroine Fantômette, ten-year-old Thomas sweeps with a curious glance what surrounds him. Beneath the carefree expatriate life, his eyes are gradually opening to another reality. A personal, tender film from Robin Campillo (120 BPM) inspired by his own childhood.

HIGH & LOW: JOHN GALLIANO (15) From Fri 8 Mar



Director Kevin Macdonald UK, 2023, 117m

The gripping and thought-provoking new documentary from Oscar-winning director Kevin Macdonald candidly tackles the rise-and-fall story of the influential and controversial fashion designer John Galliano. From Central Saint Martins to head of Dior to the drunken anti-Semitic tirade in 2011 that proved his downfall. Macdonald investigates Galliano's years of drug and alcohol addiction, and the multiple facets and contradictions of the designer's character.

Ava DuVernay directs an inspired adaptation of writer Isabel Wilkerson's life, as she digs into the nuance of discrimination while writing what would become her New York Times bestselling book, Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents.

DuVernay creates powerful cinematic images out of the stories that Wilkerson brought to light in her non-fiction work, and the dark moments of her personal life which informed its writing.

An intimately raw and magical journey through the life, mind, and heart of iconic artist Frida Kahlo. 


