Legendary Japanese director Akira Kurosawa (Rashomon, Seven Samurail reimagines Shakespearean tragedy King Lear as a historical epic set in 16th-century Japan.

An ageing warlord decides to abdicate and divide his kingdom between his three sons - with catastrophic consequences. Majestic in scope, the film is Kurosawa's late-life masterpiece, a profound examination of the folly of war and the crumbling of a family under the weight of betrayal, greed, and the insatiable thirst for power.

THE BALLAD OF WALLIS ISLAND (12A)

From Friday 6 June



Director James Griffiths Starring Carey Mulligan, Tim Key UK, 2025, 100m

From the producer of Brian and Charles and offering the same melancholy silliness. Tim Key stars as eccentric lottery winner Charles, who lives alone on a remote island and decides to hire his favourite musician, Herb McGwyer, to play an exclusive gig. Unbeknownst to Herb, Charles has also booked Herb's ex-bandmate - and ex-girlfriend - Nell to perform the old favourites. As past tensions resurface, stormy weather traps them all on the island and Charles tries desperately to salvage his dream gig.

Set in 1790s Scotland. Slow West director John Maclean's atmospheric latest pays homage to classic samurai films and bloody revenge Westerns. A young Japanese woman, Tornado, journeys across Britain with her father's travelling puppet show. Seeing an opportunity for a new life for her family, she decides to steal gold from a lawless band of roving criminals. But soon, ruthless gang leader Sugarman wants revenge, and Tornado must fight to escape a violent demise.

HOW TO TRAIN YOUR DRAGON (PG)

When an ancient threat emerges that endangers both species, their friendship becomes the key to forging a new future. The epic live-action reimagining of the beloved animated fantasy film series.

GOOD ONE (15)

India Donaldson's debut has echoes of Kelly Reichardt and Céline Sciamma but also demonstrates a director with an authentic voice of their own. Seventeen-year-old Sam is joining her dad on a camping trip before college, along with his long-time buddy Matt. But when an awkward campfire encounter between Sam and Matt ruptures the trip, it casts the trio's relationships in an ugly new light.

LOLLIPOP (15)

Director Daisy-May Hudson Starring Posy Sterling, Idil Ahmed UK, 2024, 100m

When young mum Molly is released from prison after serving four months, she assumes she can pick up her children from foster care in a matter of hours. Instead, Molly finds herself in the mother of all catch-22s: she can't get housing because she doesn't have her kids living with her, but she can't get them back without a roof over her head. But when Molly reconnects with her childhood friend and fellow single mother Amina, the two women join forces and take destiny into their own hands.

28 YEARS LATER (15)

Director Danny Boyle Starring Jack O'Connell, Ralph Fiennes

More than 20 years since the release of 28 Days Later, director Danny Boyle and writer Alex Garland reunite for a terrifying new story set in the world created by the 2002 original.

Almost three decades after the rage virus escaped a biological weapons lab, survivors still live in a ruthlessly enforced quarantine to keep them protected. When one such survivor leaves his island quarantine on a mission into the dark heart of the mainland, he discovers secrets and horrors that have mutated not only the infected but other survivors too.

S/HE IS STILL HER/E -THE OFFICIAL GENESIS P-ORRIDGE DOC (CTBC)

Genesis P-Orridge lived their art to the extreme. A pioneering musician, avant-garde artist, spiritual explorer and gender revolutionary, Genesis has been featured in films and videos, but never the full story - until now. This raw, personal documentary explores the final year of P-Orridge's existence as they grapple with mortality and contemplate a life that transcended boundaries.

RIEFENSTAHL (15)

German actor and director Leni Riefenstahl was best known for her Nazi propaganda films Triumph of the Will and Olympia. Though these films glamourised the Nazis' rise to power, Riefenstahl spent much of her life denying having close ties to the regime, while continuing to defend her work. This definitive documentary uses archive materials - private films, photos, recordings and letters to dissect the life and actions of this controversial figure.
