About the role:

This role is an exciting opportunity to join Broadway and collaborate with partners across the Midlands region to provide industry-backed professional development and networking support to producers, writers and directors and other creatives working across different disciplines, at the early stages of their film careers. The role will include: demystifying film funding for early career filmmakers; providing editorial input on funded projects; supporting professional development; and promoting opportunities available through BFI NETWORK and beyond. The BFI NETWORK Talent Executive will sit within the Film Hub Midlands team, working alongside another BFI NETWORK Talent Executive and a BFI NETWORK Talent Coordinator reporting to the Head of Film Hub Midlands, with guidance and support from the central BFI NETWORK team. They will place inclusivity at the core of talent development and work closely with other BFI NETWORK Talent Executives to ensure that the widest range of people are aware of, and can access, the funding and networks and that the regional offer is as responsive to need as possible.

About you:

You will be an engaged connector of people, committed to inclusion and passionate about film with the ability to understand new ideas and how they can be supported, developed and shared. You will be comfortable working collaboratively and creatively and possess solid project coordination, organisational skills and pragmatism. You will be reviewing short film and early feature development applications and providing editorial input on funded projects and will need to have editorial and production experience, project management skills, experience of budgeting and effective administration. You may also have experience in event management and designing training activities for creative practitioners. Given the

geographic reach for the role, you will need to be prepared to connect with filmmakers virtually and in-person across the Midlands.

About Film Hub Midlands

Film Hub Midlands is a partnership between Broadway Cinema, Nottingham and Flatpack, Birmingham and is a driving force behind film culture in the Midlands. By providing support and training, we aim to help more people in the region watch, make, and show films. We are part of the BFI Film Audience Network (FAN), using funds from the National Lottery to support a stronger and more connected approach to growing audiences for British and international film on the big screen.

About BFI NETWORK

Made possible through National Lottery funding, BFI NETWORK collaborates with film organisations and leading cultural venues across the UK to provide short film and early feature development funding, industry-backed professional development and networking support to producers, writers and directors aged 18 and above. BFI NETWORK Talent Executives are based in regional Film Hubs at some of England's foremost independent cinemas, arts venues and industry bodies including Broadway and Flatpack in the Midlands.

About Broadway

Screening independent British and World film alongside Hollywood blockbusters and classic cinema retrospectives, Broadway is one of the UK's leading independent cinemas attracting thousands of visitors each year to its four-screen cinema, Café Bar and meeting, workshop and office spaces.

Broadway's wider role includes encouraging the development of new talent and supporting learning through programmes such as the BFI Film Academy, and innovation and enterprise for people working in the creative and digital industries with initiatives such as Near Now, Broadway's studio for arts, design and innovation, and the Near Now Fellowship, their artistic and professional development programme.

Broadway hosts award-winning filmmakers such as Jeanie Finlay (*Game of Thrones: The Last Watch*, *Seahorse: The Dad Who Gave Birth*) and Wellington Studios (BAFTA Scotland award-winning *Calibre*, *London to Brighton*) who regularly receive international acclaim for their work. Broadway is also the home of Film Hub Midlands, a key driving force behind film culture in the Midlands that provides training and funding to ensure people in the region watch, make and show films and has also been awarded a BFI Screen Diversity Mark.

We will make reasonable adjustments where required, to support applicants in participating in the selection process.

Appointment is subject to successful completion of a standard DBS Check which is carried out in line with Broadway's Safeguarding Policy.

Key Responsibilities

Have the experience and knowledge necessary to lead on connecting dynamic new Midlands-based filmmakers with training and funding opportunities for short films and early feature development

- Work with the existing BFI NETWORK Talent Executive to support and develop filmmakers, writers and artists in the Midlands area at the early stages of their filmmaking careers, helping to develop their storytelling abilities in film.
- Design and deliver a responsive (online and in person) programme of training and events for early career filmmakers, writers and artists in the Midlands region
- Place inclusion and diversity at the core of outreach and funding activity ensuring opportunities are as accessible as possible, and people from under-represented groups are actively engaged with at every stage
- Attend short film showcases, festivals and networking events to inform filmmakers about funding opportunities
- Provide information and support for filmmakers, writers and artists working across different disciplines at the early stages of their careers to apply for funding opportunities
- Participate in assessment processes, reviewing applications and making recommendations for regional short films and early development projects to the BFI for funding.

Give concise, confident and swift editorial feedback on funded projects, including on short film cuts, samples and other material submitted in liaison with the other BFI NETWORK Talent Executive

- Provide creative support from script stage through edit and up to final delivery for funded short films
- Provide editorial support and advice to writers receiving funding for early feature development work, e.g. to produce initial treatments and pitch decks.
- Ensure all necessary documentation for productions is delivered on time and to a satisfactory standard.
- Act as point of contact for any escalated production issues and handle these including working with the BFI as needed.

Building effective and beneficial partnerships to further the aims of talent, BFI NETWORK and the greater BFI industrial strategy for the region

- Work with Film Hub Midlands and partner organisations that promote and support filmmaking to identify early career talent.

- Assist in co-ordinating regional talent development activity, collaborating with existing professional development delivery partners to develop early career talent in the Midlands
- Research opportunities, cultivate new relationships and develop creative methods for identifying new talent outside of usual routes of film talent development
- Liaise with national industry partners to co-ordinate activity

Be an advocate for encouraging the development and promotion of Midland-based talent including signposting filmmakers to additional or alternative support, showcasing their work and links to the wider industry

- Respond to filmmaker enquiries about talent development within the region
- Promote short films funded within the region, enabling routes to exhibition and distribution
- Attend events, local festivals etc. as a representative where appropriate or suggesting guest speakers
- Share information with the BFI Film Fund and with other regional film hubs, including through regular meetings

Reporting, liaison and general administration

- Liaise with other departments within Broadway, Flatpack and Film Hub Midlands to ensure the smooth administration of activities, including in relation to project expenditure; receipt of funding; etc.
- Report regularly to Broadway about activity, identifying any potential issues with delivery and agreeing actions to mitigate risks, and contribute to quarterly reporting for BFI NETWORK
- Use the BFI's application portal, with support provided by the BFI, to review applications
- Administer project activities for events and outreach and manage related finances, such as specific project expenditure and receipt of funding in liaison with the Finance team

Be a positive contributor to Film Hub Midlands

- As part of Film Hub Midlands, contribute towards team working and project leadership
- Inspire, motivate and enthuse staff within the organisation, celebrating our successes and encouraging ambition and achievement
- Create a positive experience for talent and establish Film Hub Midlands as synonymous with quality, diversity and accessibility
- Play an active role in strategic planning processes and be responsible for completion of operating plans, budgets and reporting

- A passion for film
- Specific experience of talent development (in film, TV or a related artform)
- A demonstrable knowledge of the film sector in the Midlands

- An ability to recognise promising talent through application / related material
- Experience of forming local and regional partnerships with a wide range of organisations, within and outside of the film industry, including community partnerships with a focus on those operating and supporting talent in the Midlands
- A demonstrable commitment to the principles of diversity and inclusion and their practical application and integration in the work environment, including through using the BFI Diversity Standards
- A high level of organisational skills with the proven ability to meet deadlines and targets while working in a busy environment
- Excellent communication skills and ability to deal effectively with people at all levels
- Experience of developing good collegiate working relationships with contacts, partners and stakeholders
- Experience of working in teams, taking accountability and supporting others
- Advanced IT skills, to include Microsoft Office
