Director Tim Burton Starring Michael Keaton, Winona Ryder USA, 2024, 104m

The juice is loose: Michael Keaton, along with Winona Ryder and Catherine O'Hara, return to their iconic roles in this long-awaited follow-up to Tim Burton's 1988 classic.

Lydia's life is turned upside down when her rebellious teenage daughter, Astrid, accidentally opens the portal to the Afterlife. With trouble brewing in both realms, it's only a matter of time until someone says Beetlejuice's name three times and the mischievous demon returns to unleash his very own brand of mayhem.

Pulp novelist Holly Martins arrives in Vienna to search for his missing friend Harry Lime. On finding out that Harry recently died, Holly soon begins to doubt the official version of events.

When Henry appoints her Regent, the nation's ruler during his absence when he departs to fight overseas, Henry lays a dangerous path for her. In 1970s Yorkshire, Richard and Juliette relocate to Richard's childhood home of Starve Acre. However, a sudden and tragic event drives a wedge through the family, which triggers Richard, an academic archaeologist, to bury himself in obsessively exploring a local folkloric myth.

Daniel Kokotajlo's follow-up to his award-winning debut Apostasy is an unnerving adaptation of Andrew Michael Hurley's acclaimed novel; a wildly eerie, slow-burn folk horror.





Kino Klubb celebrates the work of Lindsay Anderson, a leading light of the Free Cinema movement and of the British New Wave.

This season focuses on Anderson's everyman trilogy, a satirical state-of-the-nation address that holds up a mirror to a contemporary Britain that Anderson considered to be in moral decline. All three films star Malcolm McDowell as the title character Mick Travis.

This loose and often surreal trilogy follows Mick Travis's journey through British society, starting with If... (1968), a rebellious attack on public schools and the class system; followed by O Lucky Man! (1973), an absurd dystopian picaresque road movie; and ending with Britannia Hospital (1982), a sharp satire focusing on Thatcherism and the NHS. Featuring a fantastic repertory cast of greats including Arthur Lowe, Ralph Richardson, Helen Mirren, Rachel Roberts, Leonard Rossiter and many more, Anderson, along with screenwriter David Sherwin, created an anarchic trilogy of films that remain as fresh and politically charged today as when they were first made.

Lindsay Anderson's cult classic stars Malcolm McDowell in his cinematic debut as Mick Travis, a disaffected teenager trapped in a boarding school, battling school bullies, the teaching staff, and the British class system.

Anderson's film won the Palme d'Or at the Cannes Film Festival in 1969, creating a landmark in counterculture cinema with its prescient depiction of youthful revolt.

Malcolm McDowell is back again as Mick Travis, this time as an ambitious coffee salesman out on the road in pursuit of the capitalist dream. His journey quickly descends into an absurd Kafkaesque nightmare of fatalism and bureaucracy, that feels part Bertold Brecht, part Monty Python. Featuring a brilliant score from Alan Price which underpins the film's bleak viewpoint, this is a rare opportunity to experience Lindsay Anderson's epic masterpiece on the big screen.

Britannia Hospital is a savage comedy and a unique spikey fantasia that mixes politics, body-horror, and Carry On comedies. Derided upon its release, Britannia Hospital deserves to be reassessed as a stark social commentary on the political climate of Thatcher's Britain.


