

OCTOBER AT BROADWAY

Autumn is officially cinema season, and we've got a particularly busy month planned for you here at Broadway, with festivals, new releases and stone-cold classics galore.

This month, the hugely anticipated follow-up to 2019's Joker sees director Todd Phillips take a daring left turn into musical territory with **Joker: Folie À Deux**. Joaquin Phoenix returns as a now-institutionalised Arthur Fleck alongside the one and only Lady Gaga as his partner-in-crime Harley Ouinn.

Spanish master Pedro Almodóvar directs his first English-language feature, **The Room Next Door**, starring Julianne Moore and Tilda Swinton as two recently reconnected friends grappling with life, friendship and mortality.

Just a month before the US election, Sebastian Stan stars in "shrewd and darkly amusing tragicomedy" **The Apprentice** as a young Donald Trump, charting the former President's rise to fame and fortune in 1980s New York.

Edgar Wright's cult 2004 zom-com (that's zombie-comedy, of course) Shaun of the Dead rises again for its 20th anniversary this month. Simon Pegg and Nick Frost star as best mates who, after the zombie apocalypse descends, take it upon themselves to get their friends and family safely to the pub.

Ahead of the release of Gladiator II - starring Paul Mescal - later this year, Ridley Scott's original Roman revenge epic **Gladiator** also returns to cinemas in October, and there's more iconic battle action as Akira Kurosawa's 1954 masterpiece **Seven Samura**i honours 70 years with a stunning new restoration this month.

We're very pleased to once again present some of the best films from this year's BFI London Film Festival in October, direct from the festival - featuring Steve McQueen's WWII drama Blitz, set in 1940s London and starring Saoirse Ronan, and Pharrell Williams' joyful life in Lego, Piece by Piece. Sebastian Stan stars as ambitious New York actor Edward, who undergoes a radical medical procedure to drastically transform his appearance. GLADIATOR - RE-RELEASE (15)

Starring Sebastian Stan as a young Donald Trump and Jeremy Strong as the influential right-wing lawyer and political fixer Roy Cohn, director Ali Abassi's (Border, Holy Spider) first English-language film is a dive into the underbelly of the American empire, charting Trump's ascent to power during the 1980s in New York, through a Faustian deal made with Cohn. This controversial biopic – already making headlines with a cease-and-desist letter sent to the filmmakers by Trump's legal team – will hit screens less than a month before the US election.

THE TEACHER (12A)

The parallel struggles of a Palestinian schoolteacher grieving the loss of his son and an American couple fighting to reclaim theirs from kidnappers propel writer-director Farah Nabulsi's gripping feature debut. Set and filmed in the West Bank, The Teacher is built upon a strong sense of place, both physical and, in terms of generational loss, historical.

BLACK DOG (12A)

Director Guan Hu **Starring** Zhangke Jia, Jing Liang **China**, 2024, 110m

On the edge of the Gobi desert in Northwest China, Lang returns to his hometown after being released from jail. While working for the local dog patrol team to clear the town of stray dogs before the Olympic Games, he strikes up an unlikely connection with a black dog. These two lonely souls embark on a journey together.




