The brilliant Paul Mescal has big sandals to fill as he steps into the arena in **Gladiator II**, the spectacular, much-anticipated sequel to Ridley Scott's classic Roman epic.

After more than 20 years of enchanting audiences in the West End, the huge hit musical **Wicked** finally makes its way onto the big screen - Cynthia Erivo and Ariane Grande star as the iconic Witches of Oz.

Steve McQueen directs a sprawling World War II-era drama **Blitz**, set in 1940s London - Saoirse Ronan stars as an East End mum searching for her young son in the war-torn capital.

Amongst endless infighting and back-stabbing, Ralph Fiennes leads a group of cardinals through the secretive process of electing a new Pope in tense Vatican-set thriller **Conclave**.

Also this month, **Piece by Piece** is a joyful, music-filled journey through the life of cultural icon and innovator Pharrell Williams using LEGO animation.

From the director of *The Florida Project* and *Tangerine*, Sean Baker's Palme d'Or-winning latest **Anora** follows the "Cinderella story" of a young Brooklyn sex worker who impulsively marries the son of a Russian oligarch.

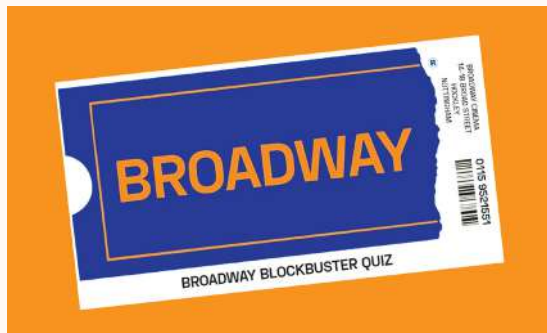
